Gwangju City



Gwangju is one of the main city of the south-western part of Korea with population of 1.4 million. Likewise many other old cities in Korea, Gwangju has long history and rich culture. Especially, democratic uprising against the military dictatorship in 1980 was a key turning point on the route toward the flourish of democracy in Korea these days. This tradition is still continued through various effort to improve democracy and human right, such as Gwangju International Peace Forum, Gwangju Prize for Human Right, Gwangju Solidarity Program, and many more.

Now the city is trying to reborn as Mecca of high-tech research and industry in East Asia. As the name of the city hints, "Gwangju" literally means "City of Light", one of main emphasis of city's strategic development is on advanced photonics industries. The photonics industry cluster in Gwangju has grown into 12 R&D institutes and organizations focusing on solid state lighting and LED, optical communication, and solar cells.

From Incheon Int' l Airport to Gwangju

For most foreign countries, there is no direct flight from your country to Gwangju City. Instead, you will enter the country through Incheon International airport. There are two ways to move to Gwangju from Incheon Airport; by air or by bus.

By Air:

In order to fly to Gwangju, you have to move to Gimpo Int'l Airport (Gimpo) from Incheon Int'l Airport (Incheon). There are two ways for passengers to reach Gimpo from Incheon; Airport Railway and Airport Limousine Bus. We, however, strongly recommend you to use the bus rather than the railway for your convenience. Please refer to the following information.

Step 1. Buy a bus ticket (at Incheon Int'l Airport)

You could find Bus Ticket Counters next to Exit 4 and Exit 9 at the Arrival Floor (1st floor). We would like you to buy a <u>KAL Limousine Bus ticket at Korean Air counter in the picture below.</u> Please do NOT purchase a 'Airport Bus Ticket' at the right counter. (Note: KAL Limousine Bus and Airport Limousine Bus are operated by different companies)

□ Bus Fare : Approximately 6,000 Korean Won

 \Box Operation Intervals : Approximately 20 ~ 30 min.

 \Box Time required : Approximately 40 min.

Step 2. Find a bus stop (at Incheon Int'l Airport)

After buying your ticket, you need to go out of from the Airport through either Exit 4 or Exit 11. You may use two bus stops (**4B and 11A**) to take a <u>**KAL Limousine Bus**</u> for Gimpo.

Step 3. At Gimpo Int'l Airport

Once you take a KAL Limousine Bus, it will take you to Gimpo Int'l Airport. Please be noted that KAL Limousine Bus may stop both at International-line Building and at Domestic-line Building of Gimpo Airport. You need to take off at **Domestic-line Building** after passing by International-line Building. You need to buy a ticket on the second floor and take a flight on the third floor.

By Bus:

In order to ride a bus directly to Gwangju, you may walk to bus terminal gate **9C** on the first floor. There is an information desk and they will assist you to find the right bus. Limousine bus leave every hour and total travel takes about four hours. The fare should be around 30,000 won (\sim \$30). The destination of this bus is Gwangju express bus terminal. The easiest way to go to GIST from Gwangju express bus terminal is by taxi. The taxi fare should not cost more than 10,000 won (\sim \$10) as long as you don't take a deluxe taxi which cost more than regular ones. Deluxe (or "moburm" in Korean) taxis are black with a gold stripe.

From Gwangju Int'l Airport to GIST (for people who entered the country though Gwangju Airport)

The best way to get to GIST from Gwangju Airport is by taxi. The taxi fare should not cost more than 10,000 won (~\$10) as long as you don't take a deluxe taxi which cost more than regular ones. Deluxe (or "moburm" in Korean) taxis are black with a gold stripe.
